

Rensselaer Park PTA is excited to announce the kickoff of the 2023 Pick A Reading Partner (PARP) Program! PARP is a PTA sponsored program created to encourage families to read together at home.

This year's theme, "RPES Reads Around the Burgh," will take your child on a reading tour of Lansingburgh. This year's PARP program is designed to enhance your child's knowledge of Lansingburgh while at the same time making reading at home a fun priority. With every minute you read together you are helping your child's classroom move around our school wide Burgh-opoly board and helping your child earn Burgh-opoly money and exciting prizes!

Here's how PARP works:

- Sign the Burgh-opoly Player Application with your child. Complete the form on our website bit.ly/RPESreads23, email a picture of it to RPESparp@lansingburgh.org OR have your child return it to school by Friday, March 3rd.
- Each day during PARP, read with your child for at least 20 minutes and fill in the reading log.
- Reading logs are due the following days: March 10th, 16th, 24th, March 31st and April 6th. Reading logs can be completed on our website, emailed to RPESparp@lansingburah.org (please be sure to include your child's name and teacher in the email) or returned to school
- Encourage your child to show his/her PARP spirit by dressing according to the PARP calendar. Please send pictures of your child reading and/or on spirit days to RPESparp@lansingburgh.org OR share them on our Facebook Page: Rensselaer Park Elementary PTA
 Each week, the class that reads the most minutes in each grade level will receive the RPES Golden
- Carousel to be displayed in their classroom.

BE SURE TO JOIN US FOR A KNIGHT IN THE BURGH (LITERACY NIGHT) ON THURSDAY, MARCH 23rd FROM 6:00-7:30. THERE WILL BE GAMES, CRAFTS, A PHOTOBOOTH, BOOK FAIR AND FOOD FOR A SMALL FEE.

PARP would not be complete without our traditional Ice Cream Social! All students who turn in completed reading logs each of the five weeks will be invited to celebrate by grade level.








Welcome to our PARP (Pick a Reading Partner) 2023 website!



Ted's Fish Fry has been in business for more than 60 years. The business was started by Ted Deeb in 1949. The first Ted's opened at 447 3rd Ave in Watervliet. That store is still open today!

The Snowman

For more than 40 years, Jimmy's Pizza has been a staple in the Lansingburgh community. Jimmy's has impeccable customer service and always supports our local Lansingburgh community through various sponsorships and donations

Oakwood Cemetery

Oakwood Cemetery is a rural cemetery in Troy, NY. It was established in 1848 and went into service in 1850. It features four man-made lakes, two residential structures, a chapel, a crematorium, 24 mausolea, about 60,000 graves and about 29 miles of roads. It is known for its dense woods and rolling lawns. In 1984 it was added to the National Register of Historic Places

Lansingburgh Library

The current Lansingburgh Library was originally known as The Lansingburgh Academy, It was a seminary or a private school that was above the high school level. It was in existence from the late 18th century to 1900. In 1911, the building was sold to the Lansingburgh Schoo District. It was initially used as a high school. In 1976, The Lansingburgh Academy was listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Huls Construction

Collar City Animal Hospital

Uncle Sam Bikeway

The Uncle Sam Bikeway runs along the former railbed of the Troy & Boston Railroad. The Troy & Boston Railroad was constructed from 1850-1852. In 1887, it became the Fitchburg Railroad and then in 1900 the Maine Railroad The tracks were dismantled in

Youth Sports

Sports have always played a huge part in our community From Troy Patriots Football to Lansingburgh Little League, there's always been a rich history in these organizations. In 1988, Lansingburgh Little League won the District 14 Championship. Youth sports continue to be a huge part of our community today


PARP Bookmark Contest

One winner per grade. The winning bookmarks will be available to color during A Knight in the Burgh.













