

MEMORANDUM OF SUPPORT

S.8531 (Hoylman-Sigal)/A.9110 (Rosenthal) Eliminates Loopholes in 2020 E-Cigarette Law

On behalf of our 2.6 million school children, their families and educators, we strongly urge you to support eliminating loopholes in New York State's flavored e-cigarette law. We are deeply concerned about the prevalence of tobacco use and its effects on our children and communities.

Closing these loopholes will ensure the 2020 law which prohibits the sale of flavored e-cigarettes will have the intended impact – to protect children from the harms of tobacco and e-cigarettes.

This bill would eliminate a number of loopholes, and give local health departments stronger enforcement abilities against unauthorized sales of flavored e-cigarette products by several means:

- Suspend, revoke, or cancel a vapor product dealer's certificate of registration for unauthorized sales;
- Cancel all such certificates of registration the dealer may hold in the state after three violations in a five-year period;
- Provide penalties if a vapor products dealer without a certificate of registration does not allow an authorized inspector to inspect the business; and
- Enhance record retention requirements and include penalties for failing to comply with such requirements.

We must protect our children and close these loopholes now - as tobacco manufacturers continue to make ecigarettes stronger, while aggressively targeting young people with youth targeted flavors, enticing packaging, and positive messaging about these products.

Further, recent research and surveys show concerning data and why we must act. The National Youth Tobacco Survey shared findings recently that about half of students who ever tried e-cigarettes report currently using them still. And almost all of the students report exclusively using flavored e-cigarettes — one study found that 71 percent of survey participants between the ages of 14 and 21 would quit if they did not have flavor choices.

Data shows that nearly a fourth of high schoolers in New York use electronic cigarettes, and schools continue to struggle with supporting students in this epidemic. We need YOUR help in combatting this epidemic, by closing loopholes in the 2010 law so we can better protect children.
